



Moosehaven, a beautiful 63 acre campus located on the St. Johns River in northeast Florida, has been home to members of the Loyal Order of Moose and Women of the Moose since 1922.

During Mooseheart's first five years, a small number of independent Moose seniors were provided residence at Mooseheart, "The Child City" on a somewhat experimental basis. However, providing a home for both children and seniors on the northern Illinois campus proved impractical. In 1918, Director General James J. Davis proposed to that year's International Convention to find "a home in a warmer climate for the aged members and their spouses.

Supreme Secretary Rodney H. Brandon purchased the historic four-story Hotel Marion and its eight acres, located on the St. Johns River in Orange Park, Florida. He named the property "Moosehaven" and the new residents renamed the hotel, "Brandon Hall." The original concept of Moosehaven was to "organize the residents so that they might help each other and help themselves, and provide from their own energy the major part of the cost of their keep."

Moosehaven was dedicated on October 3, 1922, and the first 20 residents arrived (mostly from Mooseheart) on November 1. During the first six months of operation, over 50 residents were admitted. By 1926, there were 144 residents. Known initially as the "City of Endeavor," Moosehaven residents performed all of their own work and operated a successful dairy and farm. At various times, as many as 500 Moose members resided at Moosehaven.

### Moose Fraternity Extends Deal With Trackhouse & Chastain

Trackhouse Racing announced today that the Moose Fraternity will serve as a primary partner on the No. 1 Chevrolet Camaro driven by Ross Chastain for four races in both the 2024 and 2025 NASCAR Cup Series seasons.

This year marks the fifth Cup Series season the Fraternity has paired with Chastain on the track while using the 30-year-old, Alva, Florida native in membership and charity initiatives away from the track.

#### From the Desk of our Administrator:

If you've been in the Lodge on a Saturday night or attended a Lodge Meeting, you've probably heard the 9 o'clock Ceremony. I thought I'd take this opportunity to share the history and purpose of the ceremony with you.

After Mooseheart, our Child City & School, was established in 1913, the early leaders of The Moose established the Endowment Fund to ensure that Mooseheart would be protected from any emergency that could arise. Director General James J. Davis established a "penny collection" to be conducted at regular meetings of each lodge. This "penny collection" evolved into the current 9 o'clock Ceremony. The ceremony serves to remind our members of our higher purpose as Moose to protect our children at Mooseheart as well as to ensure the continued availability of the service that Mooseheart and Moosehaven provide.

All funds collected by the Lodge for the Endowment Fund are remitted monthly to Moose Charities. None of the money stays with the Lodge and every donation you make is sent in its entirety to Moose Charities.

In addition to the 9 o'clock Ceremony collections, there are many ways to contribute to the Endowment Fund. In October, each lodge conducts a Cradle Fundraiser and in February a Rocker Fundraiser to boost funds contributed to the Endowment Fund. Many members belong to the Donors' Circle and make regular contributions directly to Moose Charities. You can set up a regular monthly donation at the Moose Charities website (moosecharities.org). Several of our members are members of the League of Guardians by virtue of contributing \$1,000 each year to Moose Charities.
