

- Did you know if you are a Moose Legionnaire and attend the once a month meeting you receive \$3.00 off your Sunday breakfast?





A Quilt of Valor® (QOV) is a quality, handmade quilt that is machine or hand quilted. It is awarded to a Service Member or Veteran who has been touched by war. The Quilt says unequivocally, "Thank you for your service and sacrifice in serving our nation."

To use the term Quilt of Valor, Quilts of Valor or QOV, the quilt must be a specific size, must have a label with required information, it must be awarded (it is not a gift) and it must be recorded.



f the many indelible images from Pearl Harbor following the Dec. 7 attack, none is more searing than that of the battleship USS Arizona on fire. On what President Franklin Delano Roosevelt called "a date which will live in infamy," two Moosheart grads were serving on the Arizona.

Robert William Apple, a 1934 Mooseheart grad, was one of the 1,177 of 1,512 crewmen on the battleship who died during the attack.

Charles Ray Cosby, a 1939 Mooseheart grad, was able to jump from the stricken battleship as it sank in shallow Pearl Harbor. In an article for the Aurora Beacon News, Cosby described swimming through burning oily water.

Cosby said, "It was more oil than water we swam though, because one of the bombs had gone down a stack and into the engine room. Oil immediately shot out of there like a gusher and the minute it hit the water, settled on top. Flames from gasoline fires soon set fire to the oil, but we were lucky enough to be just ahead of them and got safely to land."

Apple, working as a barber, was working below deck near where that bomb hit and was never seen again. Roughly 900 of those who died on the Arizona remain entombed inside the ship today beneath the USS Arizona Memorial. His name is on the marble wall (highlighted left) inscribed with the names of those lost.

Cosby, meanwhile, continued to serve through the war. In 1942, he was involved in raids on Japanese forces in the Marshall Islands and later saw service in the Atlantic Ocean.

Married during the war, Cosby worked for General Electric for 41 years following the war. He died in 2011 and is buried in Malden, MA.

Apple had enlisted in the Navy in 1936 and studied law in his spare time. Shortly before the Pearl Harbor attack, he wrote that he intended to attend the University of California when his enlistment ended. Apple was also interested in aviation and had acquired a pilot's license, also while serving in the Navy.
