Target: Members who are just beginning to engage or contribute on a local level

Goal: Welcome them into the community and encourage further involvement

Moose Power Status

Target: Members who regularly volunteer, donate, or attend events

Goal: Recognize their consistent efforts and encourage deeper engagement

Moose Prestige Status

Target: Members who have significantly contributed time, money, or effort to the organization

Goal: Reward their dedication and inspire them to become leaders

Moose Platinum Status

Target: Members who have gone above and beyond in their contributions and leadership

Goal: Celebrate their exceptional commitment and inspire others to follow their example

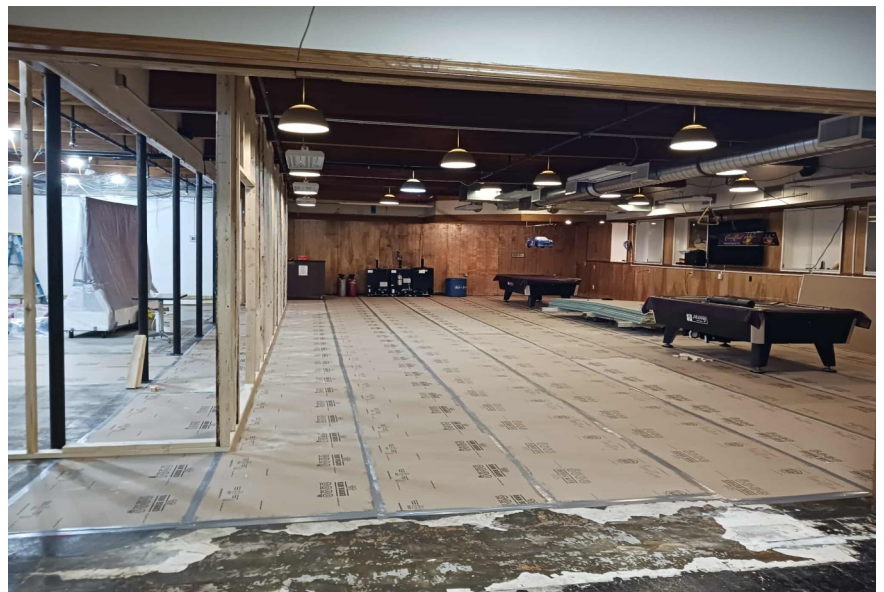
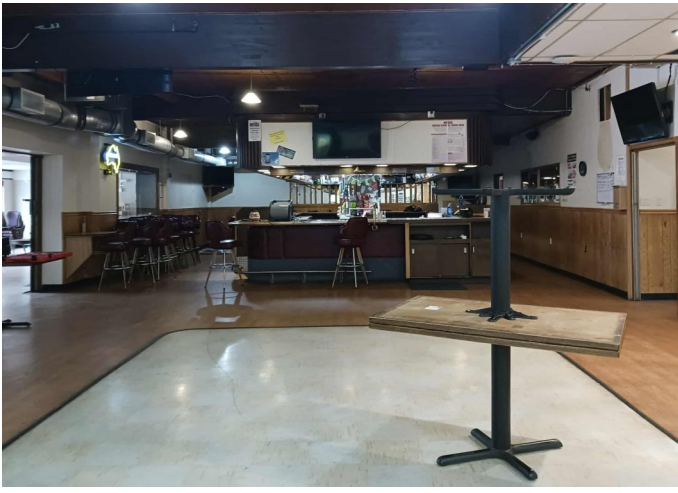

During this time, we remember those residing at Mooseheart and Moosehaven, and a voluntary collection is taken. 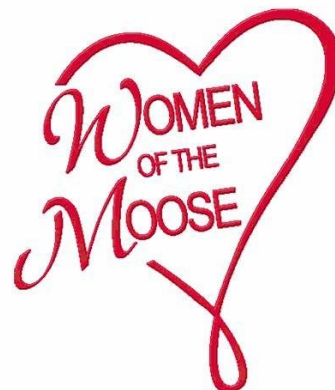

THE MOOSE COULD HELP PAY FOR YOUR CHILD'S COLLEGE EDUCATION

How? Enter your High School JUNIOR (Graduating Class of 2027) for a chance to win up to a \$5,000 scholarship with the Moose - The Heart of the Community Scholarship Program.

There is no better way to help the youth of the Fraternity than to offer them the opportunity to further their education, and that is exactly what The Moose "Heart of the Community" Scholarship is all about. The following requirements must be met in order to be eligible for the scholarship program.

To qualify for a chance at a \$1,000 scholarship the applicant must:

- Be a high school junior in the graduating **Class of 2027** (verified by a high school official).
- **Have a father, mother, step-parent, grandparent or legal guardian who is a current member of the Moose** in good standing (applicant is NOT required to reside in the same household).
- Have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale or equivalent **verified by a copy of student's transcript.**

If the applicant completes one or more of the optional criteria below, he/she will qualify for a chance at a \$5,000 scholarship:

- **In-School / Extra-Curricular activities** (i.e. school sports teams, band, chess club, theater, etc.)
To satisfy this requirement: A school official must verify this by completing their section of the application.
- **Out-of-School activities** (i.e. employment, scouting programs, music lessons, non-school related sports)
To satisfy this requirement: **Letters must be written directly by a supervising adult (boss, troop leader, etc.) and sent with an application (NOT separately) no later than June 30, 2026.**

The letter should include:

- 1) The name, title, email, and phone number of the supervising adult
- 2) Details of the student's participation
- 3) The type of activities they engaged in
- 4) The dates/date range of their participation

Volunteer on behalf of a Fraternal Unit of the Moose. (verified with signature by Lodge Administrator, Chapter Treasurer or Moose Legion Secretary on the application.)

Application, transcripts, and supervisor letters/enclosures must be sent in as one submission. Do not send each item separately.

Emailed applications must be received by **June 30, 2026**. Mailed applications must be postmarked on or before **June 30, 2026**. Application must be completed in its entirety to be valid.

Winners are randomly drawn and will be notified by November 17, 2026.
Scholarship checks will be mailed directly to the college of their choice.
